

### Shady Hollow

Following the development of Shady Lane, some were quick to see the potential of this cliff a little further to the south. The routes face west so provide a shady spot during the hot summer months.

Approach as for Shady Lane; through the yellow gate by the last hairpin into the parking lot. Follow the track immediately to the right. After a few minutes, the road descends gently for about 80m to a flat part (5 minutes from the gate). Take a faint trail on the south (left) side of the track into the obvious valley, passing through trees and boulders between rock walls on either side. Shady Lane is on the right (west) side. Follow the trail along the bottom of the draw for few minutes further. About 10 minutes from the car.

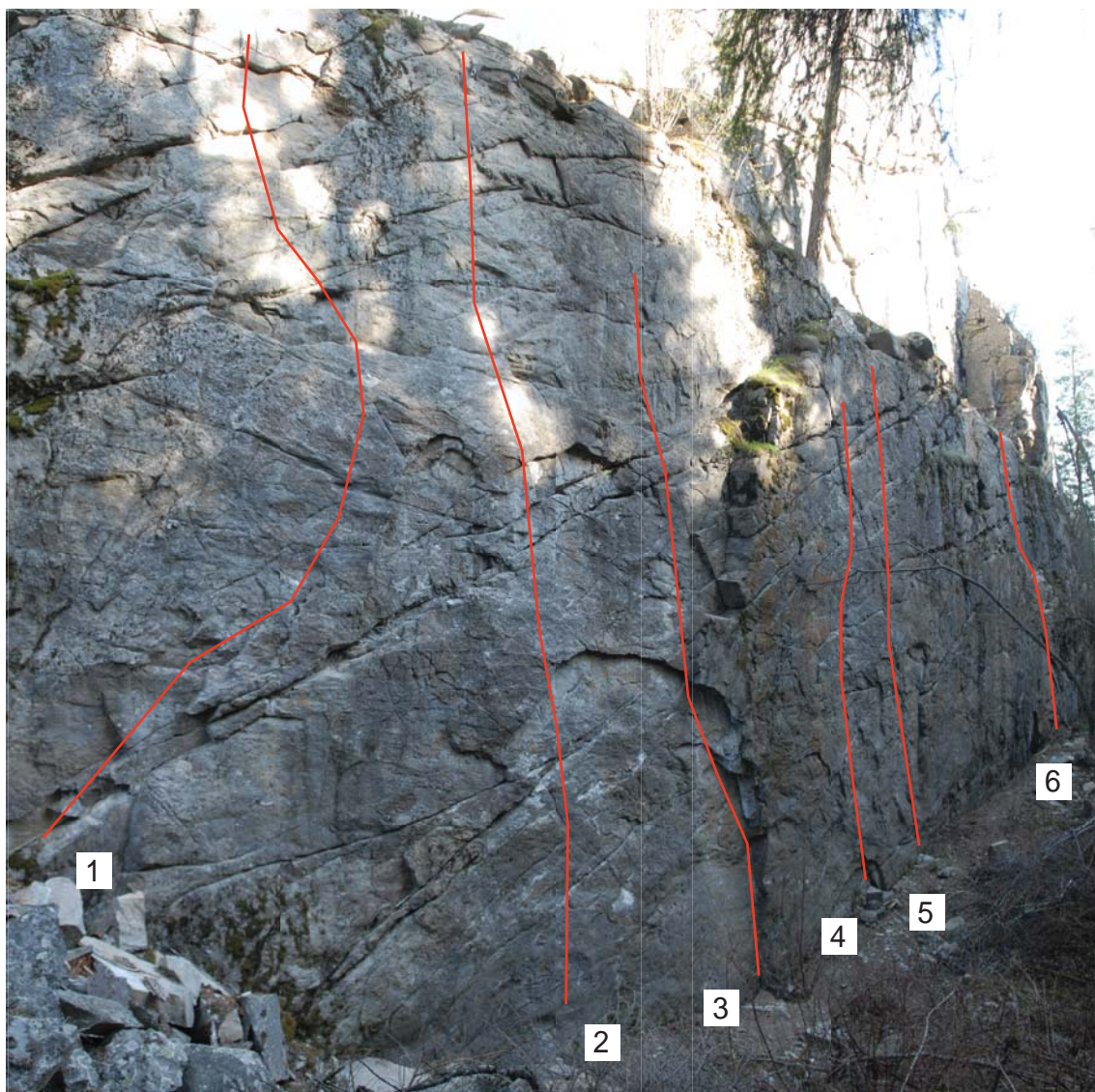
7 bolts. The obvious flake/corner

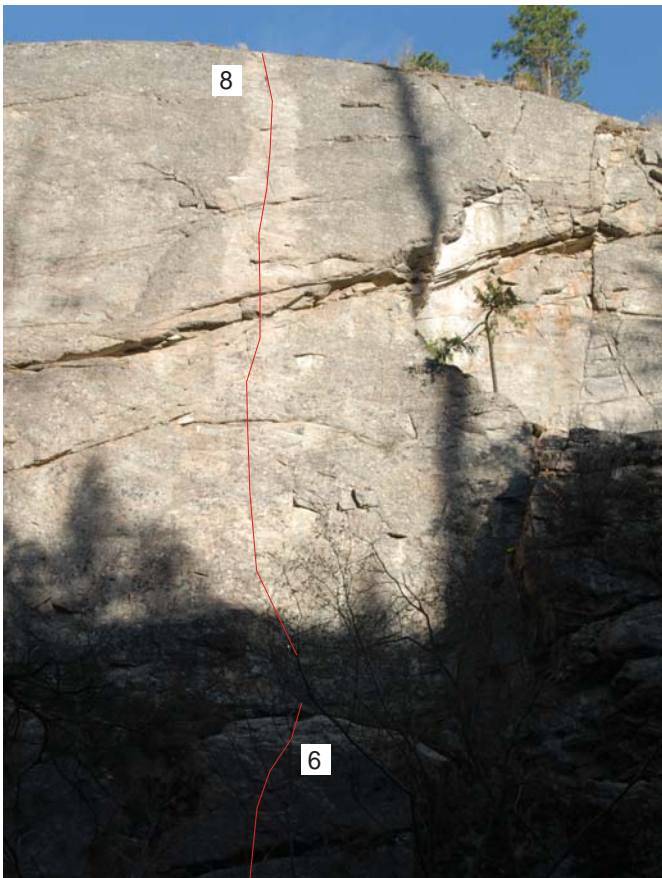
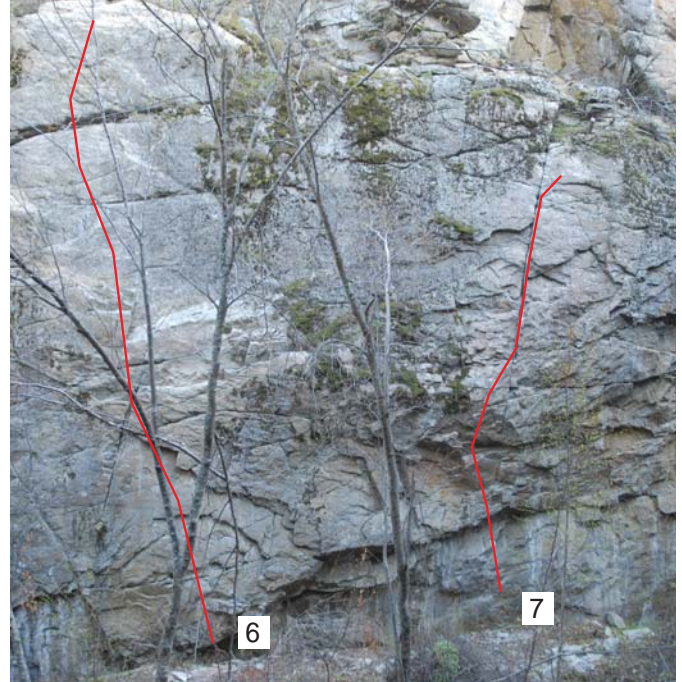
**4. Shady Business** 5.11b
